BYU-Idaho Foundation Course	Foundation Credits Required	Transfer Courses that would typically meet the requirement
FDENG 101	3	Transfer Courses equivalent to FDENG 101 (See Transfer Credit Guide)
FDENG 301	3	Transfer Courses equivalent to FDENG 301 (See Transfer Credit Guide)
FDMAT 108	3	Transfer math course at college-algebra level or higher
FDSCI 101	2	College-level transfer course in physical, social, or biological science
Physical Science Requirement	3	College-level transfer course in chemistry, physics, astronomy, geology, or physical geography
Life Science Requirement	3	College-level transfer course in biology, nutrition, health and wellness, environmental science, and physical anthropology
Social Science Requirement	3	College-level transfer course in psychology, sociology, child development
FDAMF 101	3	College-Level transfer course in U.S. History, U.S. Government, or Political Science
FDHUM 110	3	Introductory College-Level transfer course in humanities, philosophy, art history, music history, introductory literature, or theatre arts
Humanities, International, and Literature	3	Concentrated College-Level transfer course in anthropology, comparative government, geography, archaeology, western civilization, regional history, advanced literary studies

The above list merely provides examples of how transfer courses may meet common BYU-Idaho Foundations Requirements.
