

PHOTO GRUNGE EFFECT

- First add a new layer (Command+J on a Mac). Name this layer Hard Light. (When you create new layers, give them a name as to not get them confused)
- Change the layer blend mode to Hard Light. Make the Hard Light layer invisible by clicking on the “eye” icon next to the layer.
- Click on the Background layer and add a new layer. Go to **Filter, Noise, Add Noise**. I move the slider to around 30, but do whatever looks best with your photo.
- Click on the Background layer and add a new layer.
- On your new layer go to Filter, Other, High Pass. Drag the scroll until the radius is around 20 pixels, or whatever best fits your image. Select OK. Make this layer invisible. Change the layer blend mode to Overlay.
- Click on the Background layer and add a new layer. On this new layer, select two colors. I chose a burnt yellow and a brown. Select the gradient tool and choose the radial gradient function from the toolbar on the top of the screen. Fill the layer with gradient as desired. Drag the Fill and Opacity sliders until you get the look you like.
- Create a new layer. On this new layer select Filter, Distort, Lens Correction. Move the Vignette Amount slider down toward the darken side until you get the look you desire.
- Now rearrange your layers into this order: Gold Gradient, Lens Correction, High Pass, Hard Light, Noise, Background. This worked best for me. See what works for you.
- Now you are finished!
