



## Twin Falls Temple president to speak at BYU-Idaho devotional

D. Rex Gerratt, president of the new Twin Falls Idaho Temple, will speak at the Brigham Young University-Idaho devotional on Tuesday, May 6 at 2:00 p.m. in the Hart Auditorium.

President Gerratt has served the Church in many capacities including as a bishop, stake president, regional representative, and president of the Philippines Manila Mission. He also served

in the Philippines Area Presidency for four years. President Gerratt was sustained a member of the Second Quorum of the Seventy in October 2002 and released in November 2007.

He attended Utah State University and made his living as a dairy farmer. He has been inducted into the Idaho Dairy Hall of Fame and the Southern Idaho Livestock Hall of Fame, and in 1994, he was recognized as Conservation Farmer of the Year.

President Gerratt and his wife, Marjorie, have nine children, 40 grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.
