

BYU-Idaho Outdoor Learning Center Rules and Information

Bathroom Facilities

- Inside restrooms and outhouses are available for use.
 - Please use existing toilet facilities.
 - Large groups of visitors attend the Badger Creek Programs. Sanitary practices are important to our health. If this rule is not kept, there could be a financial penalty charged to your group.

Fires

- Firewood is available for your use if staying in the lodge. Those staying in the bunk cabins should bring their own campfire wood.
- No fires are allowed except in stove and existing fire-rings.
 - Keep fires to a minimum size.
- Keep door closed on stove or screen in place at all times as a fire precaution.
 - Lodge or caretaker's cabin only.
- For fire rings, it is permissible to gather wood that is on the ground and dead. You should bring your own firewood during winter use due to the snow.
- Do not start fires with gas.

Garbage

- Haul all of your garbage to the dumpster located in the east parking lot.

General Rules

- No alcohol on premises.
- No firearms allowed.
- No hunting on property or harassment of birds, snakes, or animals.
- No snowmobiles or snowmobiling allowed on college property.
- The facilities must be swept and left clean, or there will be a cleaning fee charged. The leader of the group should check the area with the resident manager for cleanliness before leaving the cabins or lodge.

Parking

- Park in the lower service lot, and a staff member will be there to meet you.
 - Please do not drive vehicles to the cabins or lodge.
 - Help maintain the *cross-country trail system and tracks* by leaving all motorized vehicles in the parking lot.

Sledding/Skiing

- Allowed on rope tow hill only.
- Use of groomed cross country trails and rope tow available to the public.
 - The tow rope times may vary depending on the weather and the staff's schedule.
- Minimum of 12 people to run rope tow.
- Lights provided by night skiing and sledding on Fridays.
- All people using an air-filled sled must talk with rope-tow operator before use.
- Please don't walk on the ski trails. It ruins and destroys them for skiing.
 - Hikers with boots or snowshoes, please walk along the side of the ski trails.
- Anyone on the hill must have signed a liability waiver form. If under the age of 18, waiver must be signed by parent or legal guardian.
- Adult supervision of all children 12 and under is required.
- Children below the age of five must ride with an adult.
- Make sure other sledders and people are out of the way before you begin sledding.
- If you fall off your sled, quickly move out of the way to avoid collision with other sledders.

Sledding/Skiing (continued)

- Walk up the sides of the hill if you decide not to use rope tow.
- Skiers/snowboarders yield to sledders.
- Building jumps are not allowed.
- The use of helmets is strongly encouraged.

Youth Groups

- An adult must be in charge of youth groups at all times.

LODGE RENTAL

- Participants should bring sleeping bags, pillows, towels, washcloths, eating utensils, plates, and cups.
- The kitchen is equipped with pans, serving spoons, spatulas, soap, and dish towels.
 - A gas stove with grill, microwave, convection oven, and fridge are provided.
- Equipment belonging to the lodge is not to be used outside or taken away from the lodge.
- Heated by wood stove and electricity.
- Any breakage should be reported and paid for by the group or the person responsible.
- Check out with the Resident Manager for cleanliness before leaving the lodge or cabins.
 - The lodge must be swept and mopped, bathrooms and kitchen cleaned, and other various items to be completed, or a cleaning fee will be charged.

CARETAKER'S CABIN RENTAL

- Participants should bring sleeping bags, pillows, towels, and washcloths.
- Heated by wood stove and electricity.
- Plates, bowls, and small pans provided for approximately eight people are available in the kitchen.
- Equipment belonging in the cabin is not to be used outside or removed from premises.
- Any breakage should be reported and paid for by the group or the person responsible.
- Check out with the Resident Manager for cleanliness before leaving the lodge or cabins.
 - The caretaker's cabin must be swept and mopped, bathrooms and kitchen cleaned, and other various items to be completed, or a cleaning fee will be charged. A cleaning list will be provided at the lodge.

SMALL CABIN RENTAL

- Participants should bring sleeping bags, pillows, towels, and washcloths.
- Heated by electricity.
- Supplied with six beds, small table, and broom.
- Equipment belonging in the cabin is not to be used outside or removed from premises.
- Any breakage should be reported and paid for by the group or the person responsible.
- No cooking facilities are available in the cabins. Cooking is to be done outside with group providing all cooking supplies and stoves.
- Running water provided through spigots located near cabins.
- Do not eat in cabins. (It could cause mice invasion.)
- Cabins must be cleaned, swept out, and inspected by staff before checkout.
