- **FamilySearch Indexing** (<http://www.familysearchindexing.org>)

Extract family history information from digital images of historical documents to create indexes that assist everyone in finding their ancestors. You can volunteer to help transcribe genealogical documents from your home. These indexed documents are then made available for all to search.

Current Projects

- **Record Search**

Record Search helps you identify your ancestors by letting you search millions of indexed records and by letting you browse images of records that have not yet been indexed. This growing list of on-line documents can help you uncover information about your ancestors.

- **Family Tree**

The FamilySearch Family Tree is our effort to take the great things we learned from the Pedigree Viewer and the Life Browser and combine them into a more full-featured application. Use the interactive pedigree viewer to see and navigate a tree and drill down on individuals.

- **Standard Finder**

With Standard Finder you can search for a standardized **name**, **date** or **place** based on your input. The Standard Finder will present the standards that will be used in future releases of the new FamilySearch. Come and try out your historical and current entries and understand how the system will interpret your input.

- **Research Wiki**

The FamilySearch Research Wiki forms a community of research experts and interested genealogists that share up to date information on how to research sources for information about your ancestors. The larger the community the more useful the data is, so come and contribute.

Past Prototypes

• Life Browser Prototype

With the Life Browser we are exploring possible ways to get to know ancestors through pictures, records, stories, maps, timelines and collaboration. Try dragging and dropping records to attach them as evidence. Not everything works, but we are interested in your feedback on the concepts.

• Pedigree Viewer

See and interact with a large pedigree or descendency.

“Prototype” - An early version of software for evaluation and feedback purposes. It may still have bugs and/or incomplete functionality.

“Adobe Flash Player” - Adobe Flash Player is a free “plug-in” for your browser that is needed by most FamilySearch Labs programs.

Terminology

“Blog” - A “web log” is a website containing journal entries that are displayed in reverse chronological order. Blogs provide commentary or news on a particular subject and often combine text, images, and links to other blogs, and web pages. Readers are permitted and even encouraged to leave comments.

“Wiki” - A web site that allows users to easily create, edit, and link pages together. Wikis are often used to create collaborative web sites where articles are written and updated by many contributors. Example: Wikipedia – on-line encyclopedia.
