

Getting Help

For violations of the Honor Code:

- For most Honor Code violations, students are in the “zone of ignorance”, and are handled best by addressing the person directly with love and concern. If time permits teach the purpose of Student Honor. A statement such as, “Were you aware what you are wearing is against the Honor Code?” is a great way to start a conversation.
- If a person is exhibiting persistent violations (zone of rebellion or hypocrisy) despite your counsel contact, the Student Living Coordinator assigned to your apartment or the Student Honor Office.
- Serious violations should be reported directly to the Student Honor office (Kimball 270, 496-1120, sho@byui.edu)

For emergencies or situations that result in missing class:

BYU-I policy states “no absences...are ‘excused’ in the sense that the student is relieved from class work assigned during the absence. The Dean of Students Office (496-3240) can assist in notifying instructors, but students are still responsible to work with instructors about making up missed work.

For illness and injuries:

The Student Health Center offers services such as general medicine, immunizations, pharmacy, radiology, laboratory service, much more.
