History

Crosswalk safety was a growing concern for the University, especially after a student was fatally hit on her way home in November of 2007. Public Relations instructor Mike Cannon had his class put together campaigns for pedestrian safety for their final project, and one group urged for the creation of an on-campus committee.

Under the direction of President Kim B. Clark, the BYU-Idaho Student Safety Council was formed in winter semester 2008. Dean Kevin Miyasaki oversaw the organization of student leaders as they held safety weeks and created informational commercials and pamphlets. During winter 2009, the council was passed on to Captain Garth Gunderson of University Security.

The organization consists of a managing director, directors, coordinators, and volunteers, dedicated to promoting safe experiences for all their fellow BYU-Idaho students.

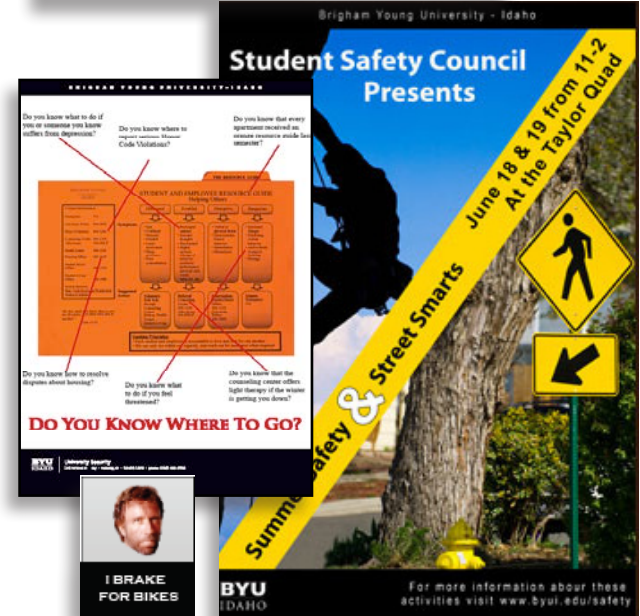
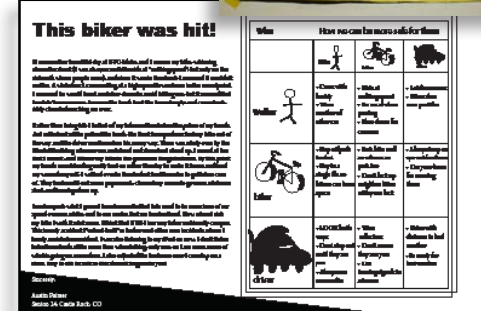
Mission
