Good PCAT Score and GPA



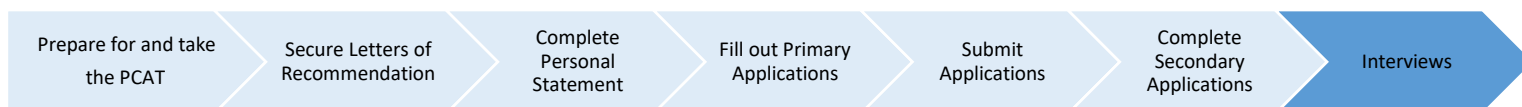
Well-written Personal Statement

Primary Applications Open in July: Plan to submit in August



Month	<i>What you should be thinking about and planning for...</i>
<input type="checkbox"/> January- June	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Work on writing your Personal Statement and experience descriptions for your application. Identify and meet with your letter writers and ask for STRONG Letters of Recommendation. Continue to engage in volunteer work, leadership activities, shadowing, and research. Thoroughly research Pharmacy schools and make decisions about where you would like to apply
<input type="checkbox"/> July	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Primary Applications open. Begin to fill out Primary Applications as soon as possible. Read the instructions carefully. Order Official Transcripts from ALL colleges and universities you have attended and have them sent to the appropriate application services. https://www.byui.edu/transcripts Complete Personal Statement and experience descriptions.
<input type="checkbox"/> August	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make final decisions on which Pharmacy schools to apply to and submit Primary Applications. Application services verify Primary Applications and notify applicants of verification status.
<input type="checkbox"/> August-September	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continue working on and submitting secondary applications. Be wary of copy and paste errors. Try to get all Secondary Applications submitted within 2-3 weeks of receipt.
<input type="checkbox"/> September-January	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prepare for and attend interviews.
<input type="checkbox"/> January-May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Schools may offer late interviews in an effort to fill their seats. Applicants on waitlists are notified of an admission offer. Typically, Pharmacy schools confirm their class by the end of July. Remember to thank those who helped you prepare for and get accepted to Pharmacy school. If not accepted, meet with a Health Professions Advisor to help strategize for the next application cycle, or look for other career options.
