

APA Style and Formatting

Reference an article from the internet

Author's last name followed by a comma and initials.

Year of publication inside parentheses followed by a period.

The title of the article is written like a sentence. The first word of the title and the first word after the colon are capitalized. The title is not italicized and ends with a period.

Webster, G. O. (2003). Mindful management: Exploring the American supervisor's toolbox. *The Buddhist Review*, 4. Retrieved September 30, 2003, from <http://www.buddhareview.org/mindfulmngmnt.html>

The title of the journal is in italics and followed by a period.

The journal volume number is in italics and followed by a period. Note: page numbers may not be listed with online sources, but if they are, list them with a hyphen.

Include the date you retrieved the information and complete web address.

Reference a Brochure

Title of person(s) or organization responsible for the publication followed by the year of publication in parentheses.

Title of publication in italics followed by the type of publication listed in brackets.

Midwestern Mental Health Institute. (2003). *Symptoms and causes of Schizophrenia*. [brochure]. Des Moines, IA: Author.

The place of publication (city and state) followed by the publisher. If publisher is the same as the organization, simply write Author.
