

APA Style and Formatting

Reference an article retrieved from a database



Author's last name and initials followed by the year of publication in parentheses.

The title of the article is written like a sentence. The first word of the title and first word after the colon are capitalized. The title is not italicized and ends with a period.

Dvorak, F. S., Rogers, W. D., & Yang, x. (2002). Effects of learning secondary languages on the primary language development or preschool-aged children. *Journal of Education Development*, 39 (6), 145-175. Retrieved September 12, 2003, from EduTech database.

The month, day, and year the article was retrieved from the database, followed by the name of the database completes the reference.

Title of publication followed by a volume number (if applicable) and pages on which the article appears.

Reference a magazine/newspaper article

Author's last name followed by a comma and initials.

Year of publication inside parentheses followed by a period.

The title of the article was written like a sentence. The first word of the title and the first word after the colon are capitalized. The title is not italicized and ends with a period.

Ives, C. V. (2003). The evolution of Americans' attitudes toward gambling: The impact of technology and legal decisions on social cognition. *The Journal of Applied Social Psychology*, 10, 503-509.

The number of the journal is in italics and followed by a comma.

The page numbers are separated by a hyphen. They are not italicized. A period completes the reference.

The journal title is italicized. Important words in the title are capitalized. The title ends with a comma.
