

CAMPUS SNOW POLICY

Updated: April 12, 2017

Due to winter conditions, the City of Rexburg and BYU-Idaho have set conditional rules for parking on the streets and in Campus parking lots. They are:

- Between 1 November and 1 March parking on city streets is not allowed. Rexburg police enforce this on all city streets, between the hours of 2 a.m. to 7 a.m. Police Officers will issue citations to owners of vehicles left on the street unless they are going to be in the way of snow removal equipment working in that area. If vehicles are in the immediate way of snow removal equipment, officers will make a reasonable effort to contact the owners to have their vehicles moved off the street. If contact cannot be made with the owners, the vehicle will be towed to an impound lot. The owner will be responsible to pay towing and storage charges to get their vehicle back.
- Interior streets on Campus fall under the above rules. The campus security officers will enforce the policy the same as the city police do with the same responsibility to the registered owner of the vehicle.
- Campus parking lots are owned by the Campus and fall under Campus rules. There is only one parking lot that is designated for overnight parking. That is the sports complex parking lot. The Parking office must be contacted to receive permission to park there.
- The Long-Term parking lots are permit required overnight parking lots.
- All other parking lots are closed from 1 a.m. to 4 a.m. for cleaning year round. A reasonable effort will be made to contact the owners of the vehicles to have them moved. If contact cannot be made with the owner, vehicles left in these parking lots will be cited by Security Officers and/or towed by the snow removal crews, at the owners expense to the tow companies impound lot. Owners will be responsible for the cost to get their vehicles back.
- Reasonable effort means: Taking information from the license plate, the parking permits or other identification visible and by calling either police dispatch or Campus dispatch, and attempt to find the owners name and phone number. If the owners name is different from the vehicle registered owner or cannot be connected with a student, we have no way to contact the person operating that vehicle. The vehicle will then be cited and/or towed.
