**CE Emphasis Elective	3	*Passing the Competency Exam is required before you will be allowed to take any 300 level Mechanical Engineering courses. The exam covers the foundational engineering topics taught in ME 201 (Statics), ME 202 (Strength of Materials), and ME 204 (Dynamics). See the department secretary for details.					
**CE Emphasis Elective	3	**Twelve credits of engineering electives are required. Students can choose an area of emphasis from the options listed in the catalog. The general emphasis area allows students to choose any of the engineering electives that suit their interest. Engineering electives are not taught every semester and so students should plan accordingly (see the BYU-I Mechanical Engineering web site for the schedule of when courses are offered).					
Cultural Awareness	3	#One experiential credit is required for graduation. There are three experiential options available: ME 299 (Mentorship -- usually done while on-track); ME 398R (Internship -- usually done while off-track); and ME 490R (Special Project -- usually done while on-track). It is advisable to obtain employment every time you are off-track. If the employment is engineering related it can count for internship credit if approved in advance. See the ME department internship coordinator for details.
